NEW YEAR'S MILESTONES

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What are some of your hopes and dreams for 2021?
- Our future is in God's hands. How does this affect your thoughts about the future?

DEVOTIONS

Read: Revelation 21:1-6a.

The new year is a time for reflection. It can also be a time of panic, both personal and global. Remember the potential chaos around the year 2000 A.D. and Y2K, the fear that computers around the globe would stop working on December 31, 1999? Concerns about personal health, relationships, and lifestyle as well as global concerns lead to those deeper reflections. The Book of Revelation was written at a time of grave concerns about the hostilities of the Roman government toward Christians as an expression of Satan's control of the earth. Instead of a message of escape from this earth, John the Seer, the author, gives us a vision of God's future that promises a new heaven and a new earth. God will not abandon God's creation but renew it, however Satan will not. God wins by making a home with us. God will dwell with us. It will be a time when suffering, grief, and worries will be no more. Therefore, be of good courage. Our future is well established and in God's hands. Yes, even as you begin 2021! How does faith in Christ, the Lamb who was slain and begins his reign, give you comfort today?

Pray: **God of the ages, through Christ Jesus our Lord you promise a future filled with light and life; give us a vision of your presence in our lives as we move into a new year. Amen.**
