A Message from Pastor Bob Linstrom

The Good Parts

*Once, in the cool blue middle of a lake,
up to my neck in that most precious element of all,*

*I found a pale-gray, curled-upwards pigeon feather
floating on the tension of the water*

*at the very instant when a dragonfly,
like a blue-green iridescent bobby pin,*

*hovered over it, then lit, and rested.
That's all.*

*I mention this in the same way
that I fold the corner of a page*

*in certain library books,
so that the next reader will know*

where to look for the good parts.

—Field Guide by Tony Hoagland

I encountered this little poem last summer and set it aside for reflection. One way to think about a poem like this one is that it celebrates the commonplace, the ordinary moments of life: a dragonfly on a pigeon feather. But perhaps the poet had more in mind.

Ralph Waldo Emerson once wrote that if the stars came out only one night a century, that night would be considered an astounding spectacle, a wonder of the world, and all of us would stay up and behold them in breathless awe — and yet, there they are each cloudless night, no less miraculous for being so frequently visible. We've had a few of the cloudless miracles in the autumnal night sky in recent weeks.

What Hoagland calls "the good parts" are like that: they're everywhere around us every day, and for that very reason, we tend to overlook them, or find them merely pleasant or charming. But in fact, they are sheer wonders, astonishments, glories to behold. Water really is "that most precious element of all." A dragonfly really is a marvel, as is a feather, as is the tension on the still surface of a lake. As are you, and me, up to our necks in miracles, every moment of every day. That's all.

A Message from President Karen Unruh

Which ministries of our church inspire you? For me, music ministry has always been an important part of my spiritual growth, both as a worshiper and as a musician. Rob Still, a Music Minister and songwriter in Nashville, TN, reflects: *Music is a valuable tool, a flexible vehicle, and a precious resource to enable people to worship God. Music in worship gives us the vocabulary and actions to express praise and worship to God. Music both expresses and affects our emotions so that we grow closer to God. Music helps unite, encourage, and inspire the body of Christ.*

I began playing handbells at my church when I was in middle school. Since then, I have continued to play handbells at every church I've been a member of, and the presence of a bell choir at a church is a significant part of what draws me there.

Being in a bell choir is a unique musical experience. While musicians in a band or an orchestra play various distinct instruments, the musicians of a bell choir are, in a sense, all playing one large instrument, each of us responsible for just a handful (literally!) of notes. There is a special camaraderie in being a member of a bell choir. I love when we support each other by calling out measures or counting aloud tricky rhythms during rehearsals or when someone offers to ring a neighbor's bell during a difficult key change or page turn. I enjoy the challenges of long runs of notes and precisely rung chords. I appreciate that Thursday from 6 to 7 p.m. is time set aside for something that fills my cup. I am glad that we can share our offering of music during worship.

All of the ministries of Trinity are supported by the generosity of our members. Our handbells carry a reminder of this within their handles, each labeled as given by a family or individual, many given in memory of a loved one. Over this past summer, the bells returned to their manufacturer for the first time in 20 years for cleaning and repair. The cost of this much needed refurbishment was drawn from a fund designated for music ministry that had been established by Denny Helzer in memory of his wife Ruth. Even members' regular offering gifts not specifically designated help support our music ministry, as our printed music and supplies are purchased through the Music budget.

I'll close this column as Dr. Kuperus closed our most recent bell rehearsal, with words from the hymn *When in Our Music God Is Glorified*:

When in our music God is glorified, and adoration leaves no room for pride, it is as though the whole creation cried: Alleluia!

How oft, in making music we have found a new dimension in the world of sound, as worship moved us to a more profound Alleluia!

Let every instrument be tuned for praise; let all rejoice who have a voice to raise; and may God give us faith to sing always: Alleluia!

A Message from Associate Pastor Dan Schewe

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. —1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

It is easy to be hypercritical.

It is easy to live a lifestyle of always wanting more.

We see these ways of life modeled nearly everywhere we look.

Yet God calls us to live our lives differently.

Paul takes up the biblical refrain to give thanks in some of his final words to the church in Thessalonica, a community he helped found and dearly cares for. He longs for them to flourish in spite of the difficult circumstances they find themselves in. Even though they are living through horrific oppression and deeply troubling economic times, Paul acknowledges that they are living faithfully despite the difficult circumstances. Paul encourages them to rejoice, pray, and give thanks.

We need to hear these words too. It is easy to spend our days complaining about every little thing and accumulating way too much stuff. Often there is a constant feeling of being stretched too thin with too much to do. All of these forces entice us to slip into a lifestyle of complaining and accumulation; it just feels easy.

Paul reiterates God's desire for us to live lives filled with rejoicing, contemplation, and giving thanks. We are invited to turn our gaze off ourselves and the things people tell us we should have and instead look outward and see how our blessings can be of use to someone else. We are reminded again and again in the scriptures to give thanks; to look at what we have as a gift from God and be thankful for it.

This November, I invite you to pause daily and give thanks. Take a few minutes at the start or end of your day and think of all the things you are thankful for that particular day. When you find yourself slipping back into that critical place, pause and give thanks.

Give thanks in all circumstances for it is God's will for you in Christ.

Grieving, Surviving, and Maybe Even Thriving During the Holidays

Dear Trinity Family and Friends,

These two holiday months are supposed to be *The Best Time of The Year!* The time we gather with family and friends in thanksgiving and the time we gather to give thanks for the birth of Christ. When we find ourselves in times of loss, these months can seem lonely, intimidating, and overwhelming.

God is present with us, in the midst of dark, lonely, despairing, and bleak times; whether we can experience it or not, God is present and God still has *more*.

More love, friends, support, resources. *More*. It may not be the *more* that we want, such as our spouse alive again, our job we were fired from, our friend who moved out of state; but God still has *more*.

Grief is very painful. We can feel no one understands. We can be impatient with ourselves. The pain of grief can cause us to want to curl up and ignore our grief and block out the world.

The work of mourning and healing, though it is difficult, can be a part of a return to wellness. Part of the work of mourning is recognizing our signs of grief, being present with our pain, and gathering with trusted others in meaningful ways.

Author Joanna Macy encourages us to not be afraid of our grief, explaining if we pave it over or clamp it down, that it shuts us down. She says, "This fear, of the pain of grief, is real... we are called to not run from the discomfort and not run from the grief or the feelings of outrage or even fear... ...if we can be fearless, to be with our pain, it turns... when we look at it, when we take it in our hands, when we can just be *with it and keep breathing*, then it turns. It turns to reveal its other face, and the other face of our pain... is our love for the world..."

On top of its difficulty, strangely, our best friends, family, co-workers, and closest neighbors – the very people who normally make our lives beautiful – may be unable to be present with our pain and difficulties. Instead, as author Ann Lamott puts it, they want to, "save, or rescue, or fix... or force [us] into submission to what they think would be a good path for [us]." It's not that they suddenly lack love for us, perhaps they are uncomfortable or are struggling with their own pain; unable to simply listen with curiosity, compassion, and care.

God's *more* may come to us as we seek out trusted others to support us during these times of grief—therapists, Stephen Ministers, Grief-Share groups, pastors, and others who do their hard, healing, and beautiful work.

During this liturgical and holiday season consider these resources: On **Saturday, November 12 from 10 a.m. to noon**, I'll be leading the *Surviving the Holidays* seminar. In addition, please also consider our beautiful Advent evening services on the four Advent Wednesdays **beginning November 30 at 6:30 p.m.** Pastor Bob will be leading us through our musical service with the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy, Dr. Darlene Kuperus will be providing her wonderful music, and I will have the honor of providing a message. The last of these four services on **December 21** will be a *Longest Night Service*. Please see **page 11** for more information about midweek Advent suppers and worship.

Rabbi Joshua L. Liebman (1907-1948), writing 80 years ago, uses the metaphor of a piano with which our loved ones brought music into our lives: "The melody that the loved one played upon the piano of your life will never be played quite that way again, but we must not close the keyboard and allow the instrument to gather dust. We must seek out other artists of the spirit, new friends who gradually will help us to find the road to life again, who will walk the road with us."

Slowly, as we move through our pain, we begin to see the *more* God has for our lives. Until someday, we too will be able to praise God for our healing, saying as the Psalmist in Psalm 30 says, "You have turned my mourning into dancing; you have... clothed me with joy..."

God still has *more* music and dancing to fill our lives; *more* blessings for us and *more* blessings for us to provide for others; God has *more* for us, even unto eternal life.

23rd Annual Interfaith Thanksgiving Celebration: Monday, November 21 at Temple Emanuel

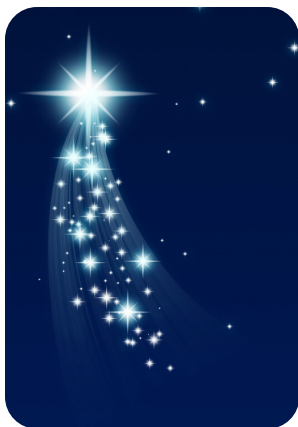

Endowment Fund Committee Recommends Nearly \$40,000 in Distributions

Trinity's Endowment Fund Committee met for its quarterly meeting on October 6 and recommended to the Congregation Council distributions of \$25,000 from the Mission Endowment Fund and \$14,000 from the Building Endowment Fund. At its October 10 meeting, the Council accepted those distributions, with plans to allocate those funds in November of 2022.

Mission Endowment Fund distributions are used exclusively for ministries beyond our doors, supporting a wide range of local and international efforts to touch those with the greatest needs in society. Building Endowment Fund distributions are used for special projects to provide for the upkeep and maintenance of our church facilities. Endowment Fund distributions are calculated by reviewing the average balance of the funds over the last 20 quarters and recommending up to a 4% distribution based on those averages. As the overall Endowment Fund balances have reached more than \$1.5 million in 2022, the growth of those annual distributions makes a larger impact each year in our life together as the people of Trinity.

Be welcome to consider special giving to support our two Endowment Funds, Trinity's "forever gifts" that will continue to support our outreach and ministry in the generations to come.

I also want to thank all those people who prepared meals for Chris and me. Each meal was a welcome blessing and it allowed Chris to care for me when I was in most need of the most basic care.

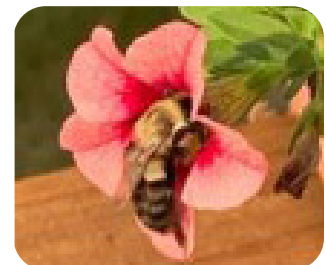
Chris and I feel so blessed to be part of the Trinity community and being connected to all of you. Thank you for the comfort and blessings you provided us.
