Lent Begins in Worship on Ash Wednesday, February 22 *Ash Wednesday Worship at 4 and 7 p.m.*

The annual journey "from ashes to Easter" begins with worship on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Lent begins with a solemn call to fasting and repentance as we begin our journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. As we hear in the Ash Wednesday readings, now is the acceptable time to return to the Lord. During Lent the people of God will reflect on the meaning of their baptism into Christ's death and resurrection and the sign of ashes suggests our human mortality and frailty. What seems like an ending is really an invitation to make each day a new beginning, in which we are washed in God's mercy and forgiveness. With the cross on our brow, we long for the spiritual renewal that flows from the springtime Easter feast to come.

At Trinity, Ash Wednesday will include worship at 4 and 7 p.m. The 4 p.m. service will be **livestreamed** and then available later in the evening via Trinity's YouTube channel for those who wish to participate in one of those virtual formats. Plan to join the people of Trinity as we seek to mark our journey from ashes to Easter in worship in 2023.

A Message from Pastor Bob Linstrom

"It's really a wonder that I haven't dropped all my ideals..."

Beloved community,

I was delighted to recently receive the invitation from Rabbi Michael Schadick to again join he and the people of Temple Emanuel for an Interfaith Seder on March 28. After several years missing this observance during the pandemic, we will gather again in 2023. Watch for more information on this year's Seder in upcoming communications.



For a couple of decades during my ministry in South Haven, the people of Peace Lutheran Church gathered with the people of the First Hebrew Congregation to share a Seder during Holy Week. That Seder, crafted by the Archdiocese of Chicago and the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, cared well for the integrity of the Jewish Passover Haggadah, the story of deliverance of the people of Israel. It also included a somber but beautiful excerpt from the writings of Anne Frank, who eventually died at the concentration camp at Bergen-Belsen.

On Saturday, July 15, 1944, Anne Frank made this remarkable entry in her diary. Anne was fifteen years old then and, with her family and others, had been in hiding in an attic room for more than two years. Three weeks after this entry the hiding place was found, and the Nazis sent all the inhabitants to concentration camps. Seven months later Anne died in the camp at Bergen-Belsen.

She wrote that day in July:

"It's really a wonder that I haven't dropped all my ideals, because they seem so absurd and impossible to carry out. Yet I keep them, because in spite of everything I still believe that people are really good at heart. I simply can't build up my hopes on a foundation consisting of confusion, misery, and death. I see the world gradually being turned into a wilderness. I hear the ever-approaching thunder, which will destroy us too. I can feel the sufferings of millions and yet, if I look up into the heavens, I think that it will all come right, that this cruelty too will end, and that peace and tranquility will return again."

Our world remains a complex, violent place. We remember the six million Jews and their communities who were destroyed in World War II by diabolical forces that turned against all that was sacred to Jews, Christians and all other peoples who hold human life sacred and a manifestation of God. We likewise remember all those who suffer persecution in our day because of their religious beliefs, ethnicity, class, national origin or gender identity. All of those who experience the wilderness of destruction and war, and the "ever approaching thunder" of oppression and violence of any kind, are the persecuted of our day.

We are called to be those who live in ways that are life-giving, seeking justice for all who are persecuted simply because of who they are or where they make their home. And then, with a teenager named Anne Frank and the countless other beacons of hope and light who have enlivened our world, to 'look up into the heavens' and find the inspiration to believe in a future where, "things will all come right, that this cruelty will end, and that peace and tranquility will return again."

The repentance and renewal of Lent is coming for Christians, a season of preparation for the new life of Easter. Blessings as we enter 40 days of the Lenten pilgrimage, confessing our sinful human nature and accepting the absolution that God gives to those who seek a "clean heart."

It remains a privilege to serve as a pastor among the people of Trinity.

A Message from Council President Karen Unruh



A year ago, I wrote that the people of Trinity could reflect on 2021 and celebrate it as a year of renewal, revitalization, and transition for our facilities, programming, and staffing. As we look back on 2022, we see that Trinity has continued this renewal and revitalization.

We welcomed five new staff members in 2022. Pastor Kari Fast (Associate Pastor for Pastoral Care) and Dr. Darlene Kuperus (Director of Music and Organist) joined us in February and Jeanne

Becker (Helping Hands Coordinator), Kathy Bush (IHN Coordinator), and Laura Norton (Discipleship and Outreach Coordinator) joined us in September. As the year ended, Amelia Crist resigned as Wedding Coordinator. We thank her for her years of dedicated service and hope to welcome a new Wedding Coordinator this spring.

We have sought to be good stewards of our property and grounds. Parking lot maintenance and repairs were completed. A new sprinkler/water feature system was installed. Plans have been put in motion for the maintenance and/or repair of our cross tower, sanctuary roof, lantern, downspouts, main entry, and gutters. A land conservation/forest management plan is underway to care for our wetlands and grounds. Members of all ages have pitched in to help maintain the trails on the east side of the property and to beautify the grounds throughout.

Our congregational life flourished as we continued to resume activities that had been halted or diminished during the pandemic. We welcomed nearly 50 new members into our life together over the summer. Many Bible studies, Grace Groups, and book clubs resumed in-person participation after many months on Zoom. Several much-missed fellowship events were back in 2022, including Trivia Night, the Men's Breakfast, and the Scandinavian Smörgåsbord. Trinity's youth attended Summer Camp at Stony Lake for the first time since 2019. Vacation Bible School and Sunday School became more robust, as in-person attendance among families with younger children has continued to increase.

Throughout the year, your Congregation Council worked hard to ensure that the church buildings and the people who gather here are well cared for. As our new Council year begins, I would like to thank outgoing Council members Kate Bredwell, Carol Butler, Chris Engle, Amy Fox, Eric Gohlke, Alaina Lundgren, and Christophe Muganza. I look forward to working with new Council members Dan Butler, Michelle Feutz, Erick Kind, Dave Marquardt, Dakota Morin, Michelle Morin, and Lauren Wright. It is an honor and privilege to serve as your President alongside such a strong and dedicated group of Council members, pastors, and staff.

A Message from Associate Pastor Kari Fast

Dear Trinity Family and Friends,

God created us to love, belong, value, attach, and bond. When we lose people/things/experiences/internal states, we experience pain; that pain is called loss. God is present with us in the midst of this loss and is actively healing and strengthening us.



LOSS

We can lose living things, including family, friends, spouses, significant others, and pets. We can lose them due to death, moving, conflict, turmoil, divorce. We can lose physical items or locations, including our house, hometown, the city we lived in, heirlooms, or cars. We can lose intangible things, including a held dream, innocence, self-worth, our faith, a feeling of spiritual wellness, a clear-thinking mind, peace, hope, our physical health, independence, or an excitement about the future.

Losses can have a ripple effect, causing other losses. For example, someone who loses their job could also lose things like structure, meaning and purpose to their lives, financial security, and friends.

There are also “unmentionable” losses – things society or our families deem taboo or shameful. These losses are difficult for us to name aloud and may include bankruptcy, suicide, rape, physical or sexual abuse, incest, mental illness, abortion, or divorce.

Unmentionable losses and complicated losses (such as, arguing with a loved one just prior to their death) can slow down the healing process because they can include multiple layers and feelings that are difficult to face and process.

GRIEF

Loss – causes – grief. At times we can choose our losses (such as deciding to take a new job or moving to a new city). We don’t choose grief. Grief happens to us. It can be a full-body experience of pain that we feel throughout our entire being. It can affect our bodies in numerous ways, causing increased or decreased eating or sleeping, muscle pains, headaches, stomachaches, fatigue, agitation, or the need to move. It can affect our mind and our feelings by increasing fear, anger, guilt, shame, blame, anxiety, sadness, depression, mental confusion, obsessive thinking, hopelessness, helplessness, suicidal thinking, taking charge over others or things, or obsessively caretaking others.

We can’t control our grief, but we may try to avoid the pain of our grief by drinking, using over-the-counter or illegal drugs, socially withdrawing, being excessively busy, and focusing on taking care of everyone, except ourselves.

HEALING/MOURNING

Mourning is the process of actively being open to our loss, aware of the impact of our grief, and doing the work of mourning. There are many ways we can do the work of mourning which may include praying, reaching out to trusted friends and professionals to tell the story of our loss and being honest about how our grief is affecting us, engaging in rituals (such as, funerals, honoring special days, etc.), and reaching out for support through prayer requests, grief support groups, pastors, and friends who won’t judge us or try to “fix” us or our feelings and who will walk with us in the bumpy journey that is grief.

May we be this support in someone’s life and do the good work of helping others as they grieve their losses. May we encourage others, even as we encourage ourselves, to seek support for this bumpy journey. May we know – whether we’re able to feel it or not – God is with us in the midst of our pain, Christ cries with us and feels our pain, and the Holy Spirit prays for us, even when we don’t know how to pray.

A Message from Associate Pastor Dan Schewe

...and now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love

—1 Corinthians 13:13

The people of Corinth were a beloved community to Paul, yet they were torn apart by conflict. In his correspondences, Paul urges them to live in love with each other. Yet what does "living in love" look like?



In our lives we encounter all sorts of ways we have been told and modeled what "love" looks like. Sometimes, we "love" someone for what they can do for us or what we can get out of it. At other times, we "love" someone for the doors they can open for us or the status we gain because of our association. We also sometimes "love" because of how someone else makes us feel. So many of the ways we are told to love are self-serving; they are ways for us to get something. "Love" in this way, as Paul tells us, is not what God has in mind when he tells us to love each other. His actual definition of love is made clear in the beloved 13th chapter of 1 Corinthians:

Love is patient, love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. —1 Corinthians 13:4-8

Love like this is rare in our world. Love with no strings attached and no expectations.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer delves into these differing ways to love in his work *Life Together*. In the first chapter he contrasts what he calls 'human love' and 'spiritual love'. The 'human love' is the one we all know too well that seeks to gain at the expense of the other, or simply gather to itself. The 'spiritual love' is only given to use via Jesus. In this love we learn to see each other not with gain as the main motivation, but instead we are able to see that we are each loved by God, so we can love one another as well. Bonhoeffer defines this love in the same way Paul does in 1 Corinthians: a love that is seeking to serve and appreciate the other as they are and as God sees them. Not as we desire or in seeking to gain. Simply to appreciate and learn to love. This is a gift from God given to us.

As we journey through Lent together, let us continue to find ways to love each other as God teaches us, not as we so often have experienced. Let us turn toward each other and learn to love as God loves.



Water and Spirit provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to the Resurrection of Our Lord/Vigil of Easter (traditionally known as Holy Saturday). Devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from the Gospel of John. The writers then bring their unique voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.

For year A the Revised Common Lectionary assigns texts from John's gospel to the second through fifth Sundays in Lent, as well Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter. These texts are included in this devotional. Several of them are unique to John: Jesus urges Nicodemus to be born again "of

water and spirit," offers "living water" to a Samaritan woman at the well, raises Lazarus from the dead, washes the disciples' feet, and surprises Mary Magdalene at the empty tomb. Return of the Annual Interfaith Seder at Temple Emanuel on March 28, 2023



Update on the “Pastor Karen Niemeyer Scholarship Fund”

Recognizing the need for pastors across the church and the potential of many lay members who are currently working in a different career, Trinity has initiated the Pastor Karen Niemeyer Scholarship Fund for second-career seminarians. The fund’s purpose is to encourage gifted candidates to attend seminary and prepare to serve in Christ’s name as ordained Word and Sacrament clergy. A series of *Messenger* articles highlighting four Trinity members who are second career pastors have been shared in months past. This month features Pastor Kari Fast, Trinity’s Associate Pastor of Pastoral Care.

The Rev. Kari Fast, Master of Divinity

Have you sensed a call to ministry from God or an encouragement from others to consider one? Some pastors speak of their calling as an experience of God or others relentlessly pursuing them until they finally cannot deny the call. Other pastors speak of a particular moment that gave them assurance God was calling them into ministry. In the Lutheran (ELCA) tradition, a call to ministry includes the sense of internal call and external confirmation by the church, synod, seminary, and denomination.

My call to ministry came when I was in my early 30s. After moving to Oklahoma and not being able to find a counseling position in our new state, I found myself as an at-home mom. The call came when I was pregnant with our second child, and we were about to move from Oklahoma to North Dakota for my husband’s new job. My call to ministry was sudden and unexpected; even three days later I doubted it was a call to pastoral ministry and thought I was to pursue Christian counseling. Seven years later, as I was applying to Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota, the seminary admission’s person encouraged me to consider again a call to pastoral ministry. After being accepted in the pastoral ministry degree program, I started taking classes, one each semester.

By then we had our third child and David’s job unexpectedly moved us to Illinois. After having changed seminaries and synods to Metro-Chicago, settled in Illinois, and decided to wait until our third and youngest child was in first grade, I began full-time seminary at Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. On the second day of school, my husband got a job offer in Michigan.

The only time of real doubt for me came after we moved to Michigan, when I had somehow missed – by one day – the application deadline to begin at Western Seminary in Holland, Michigan. I was talking with our friendly Catholic neighbor, Dan, who had introduced us to everyone in our new neighborhood, about my disappointment of yet another roadblock to seminary. While standing in the middle of our road, I said, “Maybe my missing the deadline is God’s way of saying I’m not to pursue a call to ministry.” Dan said, “Or maybe God is calling you to be a pilgrim seminarian. Wherever you move, you’re called to be a seminarian.”

It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you; he will not fail you or forsake you.

Do not fear or be dismayed. —Deuteronomy 31:8

With all the twists and turns, throughout the almost twenty years from my call to my ordination day, this journey took me through four states, three seminaries, two synods, and two pregnancies. God is faithful and was with us wherever we went.

After being matched with a person experiencing a life crisis, the Stephen Minister meets with that person on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support. The caring relationship lasts as long as the need for care exists.
