A Message from Pastor Dennis Smith



According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, there are at least three different St. Valentines mentioned in the chronicle of martyrs under the date February 14. The best known was said to have been a priest in Rome who assisted other Christians during the persecutions under Claudius II. In due time, Valentine was arrested and threatened with execution if he did not renounce his faith. Valentine refused to betray his Lord Jesus and was summarily beaten with clubs and beheaded on February 14, around the year 270 AD.

I think it's fair to say that St. Valentine died for love, though not the sentimental, romanticized expressions captured in a box of chocolates and bouquet of roses. To publicly and boldly declare one's devotion to Christ is to simultaneously commit one's self to the one teaching expressly connected with him, to love one another. What we often miss in that commandment is that such love is not in accordance with how we feel or even how deserving the object of our love may or may not be.

Take my one-time, across-the-street neighbors in Texas. It was easy to love Archie and Linda LeBron. Archie would sew a missing button on before he lent you the shirt off his back. Linda actually looked for opportunities to be helpful and, well, neighborly. Our kids played together and she would bake cookies and treat the kids before she sent ours back home to us. Of course, our kids wanted Linda for their mom.

Brian, who lived across the alley from us was a bit more of a challenge. Where Archie always had a tool to lend, Brian never seemed to have anything until he "borrowed" it from me. Brian drank too much, cussed too often, and let the dogs tear up his garbage in the alley. Yet, when his infant son died of spinal meningitis, he needed a friend, someone to love him through a terrible time of loss and grief. I could be up for that. Love thy neighbor, right?

Now, the guy who mugged my son; the guy who hit him with a brick and took his money and left him injured in a train station in Italy while I was a pastor in Reese, Michigan fussing with a sermon on "love of neighbor" - that guy presented me with a real "love thy neighbor" challenge. I didn't care if he was an out of work, desperate drug addict or just an opportunistic, common thug. I didn't care who his mother was or whether he had a wife and child shivering in some tenement. Love of neighbor reaches its elastic limit when someone I don't know or care to know hurts someone I do know and love - MY son.

That, I suppose, may be the fundamental difference between me and St. Valentine. Valentine understood that the command of Christ is shorn of all qualifications, all reciprocity, all hope or reward or commendation - what a great guy! He even loves the unlovable. The command of Christ is absolute and uncompromising. No one can say that they love Jesus and are a follower of Christ if there is any line in the sand with regard to love.

Fortunately, the love Jesus commands is not contingent upon my feelings. I don't have to like Brian to love him. I don't have to find any redeeming qualities about the person who hurt my son, not even some imagined remnant of the divine spark, to pray for him. I know. That's hard, right? Being a Christian is sometimes just hard work. But, the command is simple. Love one another as I have loved you. I still have some work to do. Flowers and chocolates are optional.

Council Corner



A Message from Council Member Brad Kessel

One of the blessings of Trinity is that well over a decade ago, following one member's gift, the leadership established an Endowment Fund. The Endowment was established to ensure the continued growth and sustainability of our church, as well as to maintain the ability to support various initiatives and future projects **outside of our adopted annual operating budget.** Over the years, through additional member gifts and earnings, the fund(s) have grown significantly and also during this time frame meaningful distributions have been made.

Trinity's Endowment Committee meets multiple times throughout the year, monitoring the performance of the church's endowment funds. The committee

is chaired by Mike Mason and consists of George Bauer, Todd Brandstadt, Chris Engle, and me, with our senior pastor in attendance.

In addition to monitoring the fund's performance the committee will recommend to the Congregation Council an annual distribution not to exceed 4% of the fund's average assets over the prior 20 quarters. This policy was established to ensure protection of the principal but most importantly the long-term sustainability of the endowments and their objectives.

Trinity has two specific endowment funds: **The Mission Endowment Fund** allows us to reach out to those who are in need, both within our congregation and beyond. It supports our efforts to offer vital assistance to individuals and families facing financial difficulties, supports various outreach programs, and provides resources for mission trips and community service projects. **The Building Endowment Fund**, on the other hand, ensures that our church has the necessary funds to maintain and enhance our physical facilities. This fund supports critical repair and maintenance work, upgrades to our church grounds, and renovations to provide a warm and welcoming environment for everyone who walks through our doors. Below is a summary of the change in each fund over the last year.

Building	\$ 604,113	\$ 688,705	\$ 84,592

Based on the positive results and in accordance with our investment policy, most recently, Trinity was able to make significant distributions in the 4th quarter of 2023. The Mission Endowment distributed \$27,000 and the Building Endowment \$18,000. Over the last eight years, the Mission Endowment has distributed nearly \$150,000 while the Building Endowment has distributed close to \$65,000. We thank you for generously supporting this ministry.

A Message from Associate Pastor Dan Schewe

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. 1 Corinthians 13:4-8

Love is a messy word in English. Many other languages have a spectrum of words to express this concept, but we use just one. We use it to refer to someone we are committed to for all our lives and for that tasty dessert you had last night. Because of this, I'm not surprised that we have difficulties understanding and expressing the concept of love as a culture.

For some, love is a transactional concept: Because I love you, you will perform this action for me, or because you love me I will do this for you. It becomes: I will love you if... In this understanding love becomes commerce.

For others, love is wielded to manipulate and control: Because you love me, you will give up something I want you to give up or endure a difficulty for me. Or, You will do this for me because you love me or I love you. In this understanding love becomes something to be used to manipulate those around you – love becomes control.

Others see love as a thrown away concept, a filler word used to express interest or appreciation. There is no depth to the concept because of how widely it is used.

Most of us have an understanding of love as it has been shown to us by people in our lives. These experiences give us a model for what we think love should be.

Yet, this is not how God leads us to understand the concept of love. Paul writes about this often. In the above well-known passage from 1 Corinthians, he reminds us what love is not and what love is. He speaks to us about how love is not turned in on itself at the expense of others, it is not transactional or abusive, and about how it should be focused on expressing commitment and care for the beloved.

All of these concepts can be confusing to understand, which is why models are so important. To help us understand love, Paul points us to Jesus. He is the model we are to follow in our lives when it comes to love. He is full of compassion and care. He sought to bring healing, help, and hope wherever he went.

As we enter Lent and journey toward Easter I invite you to focus on the model for love that Christ has given to us and to see how you can emulate it in your own life. We are to love as he loves.




Mission in India Update






